Filing Period for Kinney County Groundwater Conservation District Director Begins

Applications for a place on the ballot for the upcoming Kinney County Groundwater Conservation District Director election may be requested and returned in person or by mail up until August 18, 2022, at 1:00 p.m.

Candidates may file an application for place on the ballot in person at the Kinney County Groundwater District office, 503 S. Ann Street, Brackettville, Texas 78832, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Requests for an application for a place on the ballot will also be accepted by mail at P. O. Box 369, Brackettville, TX 78832-0369.

The Board has ordered a November 8, 2022, election allowing residents of Precinct 1, Precinct 2, Precinct 3 to elect a District Director to represent them in groundwater matters for the next four (4) years, and MUD/FCS- at- large for 2 years. Candidates must live in the rural area of that precinct which is defined as outside the city limits of Brackettville and Fort Clark Springs. MUD/FCS position must reside on FCS.

According the Section 141.001 of the Texas Election Code, a candidate for public elective office (including Water District Director) must:

- Be a United States citizen;
- Be 18 years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled at the election;
- Have resided continuously in the state for 12 months and in the territory from which the office is elected for 6 months immediately preceding the following date: the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot.
- · Have not been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court; or
- Have not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities.
